First, Steve Zuber, Principal at the BarberMurphy Group and SIOR Leader, and Eric Whitfield, Ameren Illinois Economic Development Manager have stepped forward to serve as the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Leadership Council's Economic Development Committee, respectively. Steve has in-depth knowledge of this marketplace and thrives on bringing new businesses and closing deals in SWIL. In 2019, Ameren Illinois made a commitment to its service territory in Illinois by building a new economic development team consisting of 16 highly qualified ED professionals focused on driving ED activities in Central and Southern Illinois.

Strategic Planning and Measurable Progress

According to Steve Zuber, "One of the goals we had for 2021 was to build a solid working relationship with DCEO and Intersect Illinois to take advantage of the resources available to us thru those organizations. I am happy to announce that Tracey Glenn - Illinois DCEO SWIL Regional Representative is now a member of our ED committee and Alya Woods the acting CEO for Intersect Illinois have agreed to meet with us on a monthly basis to discuss programs and opportunities to work together." These developing new relationships are very exciting to bring more state of Illinois attention and resources to SWIL communities. Further the ED Refresh team is focusing its attention on Business Retention & Expansion (BR&E) activities which account for approximately 80% of business growth within our region. Eric Whitfield indicated, "Our plan is to work with all ED practitioners in our region to assist with business retention meetings in their communities. Our goal is to gain competitive intelligence information using a survey format to appropriately assist with solving problems that are of concern for businesses in the region. The program will improve communications with key businesses and assist in identifying opportunities and threats. We will collaborate with other Leadership Council Committees as needed to work together and solve problems as they are brought to our attention." From the initial planning of the ED Refresh activities, every aspect of economic development has been thoroughly evaluated and new strategies have been developed move our region forward with measurable results and data driven progress!
